

THE HISTORY CHANNEL

On Jan. 5, 1914, Henry Ford made the welcome announcement that he was doubling his assembly-line employees' pay. However, there was a perhaps not-so-welcome catch -- home inspections to check for alcohol consumption and untidy living

On Jan. 6, 1996, snow began blanketing Washington, D.C., and the eastern seaboard in a blizzard that killed 154 people and ended up costing more than a billion dollars in damages before it ended.

On Jan. 7, 1891, future novelist and folklorist Zora Neale Hurston was born in Notasulga, Alabama. Though she would eventually publish more books than any other Black woman in America, by the time she died in 1960 she'd failed to gain a mainstream audience and was poor and alone in a welfare hotel. Today she is considered one of the most important Black writers in American history.

* On Jan. 8, 1963, Leonardo da Vinci's masterpiece, the Mona Lisa, was exhibited for the first time in the U.S. at Washington, D.C.'s National Gallery of Art. More than 2,000 dignitaries, including President John F. Kennedy, came out to view it. The exhibit opened to the public the following day.

On Jan. 9, 1984, Angelo Buono, one of the Hillside Stranglers, was sentenced to life in prison for his role in the rape, torture and murder of 10 young women in Los Angeles. His cousin and partner in crime, Kenneth Bianchi, testified against Buono to escape the death penalty himself.

On Jan. 10, 1863, the London Tube, the world's first urban underground railway, opened. Since its first tunnel ran under the River Thames and had no ventilation, it was always filled with smoke.

On Jan. 11, 1775, Francis Salvador, the first Jewish person to hold an elected office in the Americas, took his seat on the South Carolina Provincial Congress. In July he earned the nickname the "Southern Paul Revere" when he rode 30 miles to warn of a Cherokee attack on backcountry settlements, and just a month later he became the first recorded Jewish soldier to be killed in the Revolutionary War.

THE HISTORY CHANNEL

On Dec. 29, 1609 or 1610, Count Gyorgy Thurzo made an investigative visit ordered by King Matthias to Csejthe Castle in Hungary and made a horrifying discovery: Countess Elizabeth Bathory overseeing the torture of young girls. Already known for her abuse and murder of servants and peasants, her title and high-ranking relatives had previously given her impunity, but her atrocities eventually led to her being cited as one of history's first vampires.

On Dec. 30, 1936, autoworkers occupied the General Motors Fisher Body Plant Number One in Flint, Michigan, in one of America's first sit-down strikes, which lasted 44 days. Their aim: to win recognition of the United Auto Workers as the only bargaining agent for GM's employees. An additional goal was for the company to stop outsourcing work to nonunion plants and to establish a fair minimum wage scale, a grievance system and a set of procedures to help protect assembly-line workers from injury.

On Dec. 31, 1879, inventor Thomas Edison delighted onlookers with the first public demonstration of his incandescent lightbulb in Menlo Park, New Jersey. The Pennsylvania Railroad Company even ran special trains to the city for the event.

On Jan. 1, 1995, the tales of giant rogue waves recounted by sailors for centuries were finally proved when a freak 85-foot-high wave was measured hitting the Draupner oil platform off the coast of Norway.

On Jan. 2, 2006, an explosion in the Sago Mine in Sago, West Virginia, trapped 13 coal miners. Tragically, all but one eventually succumbed to carbon monoxide poisoning. The cave-in launched scrutiny and criticism of the media, the company that owned the mine and then-president George W. Bush's administration.

On Jan. 3, 1993, backup quarterback Frank Reich led the Buffalo Bills to a 41-38 overtime victory over the Houston Oilers in an American Football Conference playoff game immortalized to football fans as "The Comeback."

On Jan. 4, 2007, Nancy Pelosi, a Democratic representative from California, became the first woman to hold the Speaker of the House position. She would become Speaker again in 2018.

Good Fortune (Cookies) Ahead

Don't put away your holiday baking supplies yet. Start 2026 with your own homemade fortune cookies complete with a special message or prediction hidden inside. They're fun party favors for a New Year's celebration or a unique dessert for a weekend

For 6-8 cookies, you will need:

- 1/4 cup flour
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- 2 tablespoons cooking oil
- 1 egg white at room temperature
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 teaspoon water

Preheat oven to 300 degrees.

In medium bowl, combine sifted flour, cornstarch, sugar and salt. Stir in oil. Add egg white, vanilla and water and stir until smooth.

Pour 1 tablespoon of the batter onto a greased baking sheet. Spread with an offset spatula or the back of a spoon to form a 3-4 inch circle. Make 2 more rounds of dough on the sheet, although I suggest you

bake one at a time at first until you get the hang of the folding technique which follows.

Bake about 10-12 minutes or until cookie turns a light brown color.

While you wait, let your kids be "writers" and compose lines for 21/2 by 1/2-inch strips of paper.

When the cookie is done, an adult should remove it from the oven. Quickly loosen cookie with a spatula and place on a clean kitchen towel. Set a fortune strip across the center with an end hanging out the side. Wearing potholders, fold the cookie in half to make a semi circle with the curved edge upward. Press edge together for a few seconds until it seals.

While the cookie is still pliable, immediately grasp the pointed ends of cookie with both hands and pull them together to crease. At this point it should be cool enough for your child to hold in place for about 20-30 seconds until the cookie is crisp and keeps its final "fortune cookie" shape.


Set cookies in mini muffin tins to hold their shape until completely cool. Store in airtight container.

Here's a Tip: Use 1/3 cup batter for each cookie and bake for 2-3 minutes longer to create giant fortune cookies.

Tubbs Hill Fund over the top

Completion of acquisition of Tubbs Hill by the City of Coeur d' Alene has been made possible by a contribution of approximately \$9,000 from K.A.W. Developments, Inc. The contribution is in the form of a waiver of accrued interest on the land contract made by The Trust For Public Land as purchaser from K.A.W. Develop-ments, Inc. The Trust For Public Land in turn shall contribute the amount of interest waived to the City to apply upon the purchase price.

Greg Archibald, Executive Vice President of The Trust For Public Land stated: "The generous action of K.A.W. Developments, Inc. permits completion of purchase of the property with funds previously committed by the City, Bureau of Outdoor Recreation, the George Fredrick Jewett Foundation and private contributions. With the cooperation and civic spirit of V. J. 'Spud' West and James T. Knudson, major shareholders in K.A.W. Developments, Inc. the dream of acquisition of almost all of the remaining undeveloped. almost all of the remaining undeveloped property on Tubbs Hill is now reality."

With this contribution, there is now a balance in the Tubbs Hill fund after payment of the purchase price of approximately \$2,000 which can be administered through representatives of the fund raisers in cooperation with the City Park and Recreation Department for trail improvements upon the hill.

Final application has been made to the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation for advance funding, according to Kent Ellis of the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation, and matching funds should be in the hands of the City in about three weeks.



Four Moose Relocated From University Of Idaho Arboretum

- Idaho Dept. of Fish & Game -

On Dec. 18, Fish and Game successfully relocated a cow moose, bull and two calves from the University of Idaho arboretum to a more suitable habitat several miles outside of town. While the public enjoys the presence of these amazing animals, their prolonged stay in populated areas can pose safety concerns for both humans and wildlife. These moose have become increasingly habituated to the easy living conditions on campus, raising concerns about their safety and potential conflicts with students, faculty, and local residents.

To prevent any risk to the animals or the public, Fish and Game staff carefully darted and transported the moose to a remote location where they can thrive in a more natural environment. "Relocating wildlife is typically a last resort, but in this case, it was the best decision for both the moose and the community," said Jana Ashling, Clearwater Regional Wildlife Manager. 



Drinking Straw Day January 3rd

On January 3rd National Drinking Straw Day commemorates the date in 1888 that Marvin C. Stone received the patent for the paper drinking straw. Since then, a variety of drinking straws are used.

It is believed the Sumerians used the very first drinking straws for drinking beer. Archeologists speculate they used the straws to avoid the solid byproducts of fermentation that would have sunk to the bottom. The oldest drinking straw known to be in existence was found in a Sumerian tomb dated 3,000 B.C.E. This found straw was a gold tube inlaid with a precious blue stone.

The Argentines used a similar metallic device called a bombilla. Used for hundreds of years, the bombilla acted as both a straw and a sieve.

Today, manufacturers make a variety of reusable straws. From stainless steel and glass to bamboo and silicone, they not only save money and the environment, but they are also fun to use. They come in a variety of creative shapes and colors.

The Regal Recipe to Carry You from Christmas to the New Year

After the whirlwind of Christmas cooking, I like to glide into the last week of the year with recipes that practically make themselves. This is the stretch when time feels wobbly, leftovers rule the fridge and we're all leaning toward lighter meals that don't require much effort. Let me introduce you to an old classic: Coronation Chicken Salad, the make-ahead marvel we all need right now.

If you've ever enjoyed English tea sandwiches, you've likely met this jewel of a recipe. Created in 1953 for Queen Elizabeth II's coronation luncheon, it has been gracing tea tables and ladies' luncheons ever since. Think of it as chicken salad that went to finishing school but still knows how to have fun.

This is an ideal "between holidays" dish. It can be made ahead, improves overnight and waits patiently in the fridge until hunger strikes.

The magic comes from a creamy dressing kissed with curry, a bit of fruit for sweetness, a squeeze of lemon for brightness and toasted almonds for crunch. It's comforting yet fresh, transforming humble chicken into something fit for a celebration.

Provided is the classic version, made from scratch. But here's a secret: This recipe is wonderfully forgiving. Leftover roast chicken works beautifully, and a rotisserie chicken is a perfectly acceptable shortcut.

A note on mango chutney: Many traditional recipes call for Major

Grey's mango chutney. It does add subtle depth, but not enough to justify buying a whole jar for just a few tablespoons, unless you plan to make this often or already enjoy chutney.

CORONATION CHICKEN SALAD

Yield: 8 servings

Total time: 50 minutes



The salad that turns leftovers into something fit for a queen.

1 1/4 pounds (4 cups) cooked chicken, diced (all breasts or a mix)

1/2 cup sliced almonds, toasted

3/4 cup mayonnaise, plus more as needed

1/2 cup sour cream or plain unsweetened Greek yogurt

1 tablespoon curry powder, plus more to taste

1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice

1/2 teaspoon granulated sugar

3/4 cup diced celery

1/2 cup finely sliced shallots, green onions or scallions (I used a mix)

1 teaspoon fine sea salt, to taste

1/2 teaspoon black pepper, to taste

1/2 cup diced dried apricots and/or dried mango (I used half of each)

1/4 cup golden raisins

Optional: 2 tablespoons mango chutney

Shred or cut the chicken into small, evenly sized pieces (about 1/2-inch). Toast the almonds. Set aside.

In a large bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, sour cream or yogurt, curry powder, ginger, lemon juice and sugar. Add celery, onions, salt and pepper. Stir to combine. Fold in the chicken, almonds and dried fruit. Add a little more mayo if it looks dry. Season and adjust flavors to your liking: with additional salt and pepper, more curry for warmth, more lemon for zing.

Allow the salad to rest in the fridge at least 30 minutes before serving. The flavors bloom over time, and it keeps beautifully for up to four days.

Serving Ideas:

- Spoon onto crackers for an instant snack.
- Serve over mixed greens for a lighter lunch.
- Serve with basmati rice.
- Make tea sandwiches or mini croissants for a New Year's brunch board.
- Roll into lettuce cups to balance out a month of cookies.

As we wrap up one year and step (thankfully) into the next, here's a recipe that makes it all feel easier. A little sweet, a little savory and a whole lot of comfort. And that, my friends, feels like the right way to start 2026. Happy New Year from Divas On A Dime!

19th-Century Furniture

Sometimes, people like to think of the past as a steady, stable time where tradition ruled the day. Ironically, learning about antiques can prove that notion wrong; and some of the best lessons can come from 19th-century furniture. Technological advances made complicated furniture designs more accessible, and the growing nouveau riche meant more customers in need of furniture, often with more extravagant tastes.

The Merklen Brothers of New York, active between the 1880s and 1900, were among the furniture makers taking advantage of new tools and catering to new tastes. The chair pictured here, with twisted posts, a lattice back and a pair of brass finials shaped like storks' heads, is an example of their work. It sold for \$409 at Forsythe's Auctions LLC.

Unusual shapes, barley twists and figural brass fittings make Merklen Brothers furniture unique. An identification tip: Furniture feet in the form of a carved wood claw clutching a glass ball were popular at the time. Merklen Brothers, however, made their ball-and-claw feet with a wooden ball, as seen on this chair.

My father received a picture, possibly in the 1950s, that I am trying to identify. It looks like it is signed in pencil, but I can't make out the signature.

Based on the signature, it sounds like your picture is a print. If it has any publisher or copyright information, that can help you with identification. Usually, the best way to identify a picture is to contact an art museum. Some large art museums have events where the public can have artworks authenticated and learn more about them. If there is a college or university with a fine arts department in your area, they may also be able to help. You can also

check your library for access to online art databases or printed artist directories.





Watch for Wildlife on Highways and Avoid Costly Collisions

– Idaho Fish & Game -



With big game animals at lower elevations, wild-life-vehicle collisions tend to increase during winter.

Winter is already tough for deer, elk, and other big game animals, and being near busy roads and highways can be deadly, so drivers are asked to keep a sharp eye out and avoid costly and potentially dangerous collisions.

Hitting a deer or an elk is hazardous to drivers and passengers, and often results in thousands of dollars in vehicle damage, not to mention a preventable loss of wildlife.

"Increased activity and decreased visibility is a dangerous combination. Motorists need to be extra cautious and slow down," said Toby Boudreau, Fish and Game Deer and Elk Coordinator. "Being extra diligent while driving is your best defense."



The following precautions will help reduce your chances of an animal collision:

• Big game animals are especially active at dawn, dusk and at night. Motorists should drive extra cautious during these times.

 Scan ahead and watch for movement, especially near the fog line and side of the road. When driving at night, watch for shining eyes in headlights.

- If you see one animal cross the road, slow down immediately and look for more to follow.
- Pay extra attention in areas posted with wildlife crossing signs. They are there for good reason.
- Using high beams can help you spot wildlife, but be considerate of other drivers when using them.
- Don't tailgate. Always keep a safe distance between you and the car in front of you to avoid an accident. If that driver brakes suddenly for an animal in the road, you may not be able to react in time.
- Don't swerve and risk losing control of your vehicle. Try to brake as much as possible and stay on the roadway.

The most serious crashes occur when drivers lose control of their vehicles trying to avoid an animal. It is usually safer to strike the animal than another object such as a tree or another vehicle.

Motorists should report any injury collision to the public safety dispatcher by calling 911, which will send officers to the scene. If possible, move your vehicle to a safe place and alert oncoming traffic with your emergency flashers until law enforcement authorities arrive.

Drivers who come across a dead animal on the side of the road are encouraged to report the roadkill on Idaho Fish and Game's website. The information collected on wildlife collisions helps identify highrisk areas and possible solutions to make highways safer.

People may also recover and keep some game animals killed by accidental auto collisions. You have 24 hours to notify Fish and Game if you salvage an animal, and 72 hours to obtain a salvage permit.

For more information on Fish and Game's roadkill and salvage webpage, including reporting requirements and a list of species legal to salvage, refer to or contact your nearest Fish and Game office.

Millville Glass

What cities come to mind when you think of glassmaking? Venice, Italy? Waterford, Ireland? Sandwich, Massachusetts? How about Millville, New Jersey? Millville had a thriving glass industry by the 1860s. Many glassworkers were immigrants, familiar with techniques like lampworking and millefiori that had been practiced around the Mediterranean for hundreds of years.

Working in the Millville factories, they developed and experimented with new techniques, often by making paperweights. These paperweights were not production items; glassworkers made them on their own time to try out techniques or to sell or give to friends and family. They were part folk art, part glass art.

The most famous design was the "Millville rose," which had a realistic-looking rose with crimped petals and leaves inside the clear glass ball. Another design, made by pulling chips of colored glass, is said to be inspired by a lily flower, but is today called the "umbrella." The two paperweight inkwells pictured here, which sold together for \$256 at Alderfer Auction Company, have the umbrella design.

I have a color print by Currier & Ives. How can I tell if it is an original?

Currier & Ives made their famous lithograph prints from 1857 to 1907. They have been reproduced many times since then. Check the size of your print. Currier & Ives prints were originally made in specific sizes. They could be very small (up to 7 x 9 inches), small (8 4/5 x 12 4/5 inches), medium (9 x 14 inches to 14 x 20 inches), and larger. Other sizes are usually later reproductions. Sometimes, original prints are trimmed to different sizes, which lowers their value. There are many books on Currier & Ives prints that can help you identify and value yours. Look for them at your library. A dealer who specializes in prints or books may be able to

help you authenticate yours by its coloring, paper and printing method.

TIP: If using a glass shelf to display a paperweight collection, be sure it is strong enough. The ideal size is 18 inches long, 4 inches deep, 1/4 inch thick. Paperweights are heavy, and collectors tend to add "just one more." Glass will become more brittle and break with age.



Beavers: The Ultimate Ecosystem Engineers

(StatePoint) As the sun sets over a forest stream, a beaver family gets to work. For millions of years, these large rodents with bright orange teeth and a flat paddle-shaped tail have been reshaping land-scapes by craftily constructing dams that slow flowing water, creating ponds where they build their lodge homes. Chomping through the night, they drag aspen and willow branches through the water, stack them with precision, and seal the gaps with mud and plants. All this hard work benefits people and the planet.

"Thanks to their impressive building skills, these industrious animals, which are found across most of North America, are a keystone species—an animal that supports its entire habitat," says Clay Bolt, manager of Great Plains Communications at World Wildlife Fund.

Many wetlands started as beaver-dammed streams. As the beaver pond grows, it can support an increasing number of plants and animals. Frogs splash at the edges, fish dart beneath the surface, and many species of birds find refuge in these lush habitats. But there's an invisible benefit too – these waterlogged areas are amazing at trapping air pollution. Studies show that beaver-made wetlands provide services contributing to clean air and water worth hundreds of millions of dollars—though to the beavers, it's all in a day's work.

During a heavy rainstorm, while some streams and

rivers overflow their banks, a beaver-engineered stream system handles the floodwaters with ease. Their dams work like aquatic speed bumps, creating winding paths that slow rushing water. This prevents soil washing away and allows rich nutrients to settle to the bottom. Over time, this activity gradually raises the stream beds and reconnects them to surrounding land that used to flood naturally. And during dry spells, beaver dams release stored water slowly, keeping streams flowing when they might otherwise dry up. Perhaps most impressively, these structures function like a free water treatment plant, cleaning water by trapping dirt and filtering out pollutants like nitrogen and phosphorus.

Recent studies have also found that areas with beaver activity burn much less severely during wildfires – suffering only one-third the damage compared to similar areas without beavers. In the western United States, where landscapes are subject to drought and wildfires, fires often burn everything except areas surrounding beaver complexes. There, even during dry spells, water continues to soak into the ground, refilling underground water supplies and keeping plants moist. Putting this into practice, World Wildlife Fund is working with ranchers in the Northern Great Plains to recreate beaver habitat by constructing dams-Beaver Dam Analogs or BDAS-that mimic the crafty rodent's water management systems to store water, a particularly precious resource in this arid habitat. Some landowners are even seeing beavers return thanks to the more favorable conditions provided by BDAs.


"By protecting beaver families and welcoming them back to waterways, communities can benefit from their building skills to create landscapes that better withstand severe weather, support wildlife, and suppress wildfire, one carefully laid stick at a time," says Bolt.
